There are some 30/40 works in oils and soft pastels and they are inspirational. The colours are bright but they don't shriek, they sing out to you, the blending is superb and you can loose yourself in the emotions the colours produce. I also loved the simplicity of the charcoal drawings on paper with their meaningful message.

# Jenny Saville's work - in pictures at Modern Art and Ashmolean Museum, Oxford 23 June- 16th September 2012



This is your last chance to see a unique collection of Jenny Saville's challenging but superbly executed large format, figurative paintings. Surprisingly, this is Saville's first solo show and brings together a large body of work stretching over two decades. Her most recent work, a very personal depiction of motherhood, was hung whilst the paint was still drying just before the show opened. Oxford is a fitting venue for this show as Saville has a studio in the city.

Saville studied at the Glasgow School of Art from 1988-92; going on to post

graduate study the following year at the Slade. Her entire postgraduate

show was purchased by Charles Saatchi who became a strong promoter and patron of the artist. She was catapulted to fame through as one of the YBA through the Sensation Show in 1997. Often referred to as the heir to Lucien Freud her skill in painting nudes, portraits, mountainous flesh, twisted and entwined often in menacing and disturbing poses, on a grand scale can both shocking and beautiful in equal measures.

As a further tribute to her talent, two of Saville's works can be found in the Ashmolean hung between paintings by Veronese and Titian's 'The



Triumph of Love'. A daring move by the Ashmolean but they 'work' extraordinarily well against the old masters. I encourage you to make the trip to Oxford to catch this extraordinary show.
